

**Implementing Non-Addictive Medication In Criminal Justice  
Treatment Settings**

Date: Tuesday, October 2, 2012

Description:

Use of FDA approved medications to treat addiction is considered an evidence-based approach that has been shown to aid in reducing relapse and being successfully incorporated into criminal justice treatment settings. In this session, detailed information will be presented on a non-narcotic, non-addictive medication that is FDA-approved for the treatment of alcohol dependence and opioid dependence. This medication does not cause euphoria and does not have issues with abuse or diversion. Attendees will hear from national leaders on the use of non-addictive medication in a variety of criminal justice treatment settings including prior to release from incarceration as well as within Veteran populations. Session participants will learn about the safety and efficacy of the medication, as well as practical information about how to make the medication available to participants and how to integrate it within the court processes, probation, counseling and other recovery supports. Attendees will also hear directly from a participant about his experience with the medication as part of a comprehensive criminal justice treatment program.

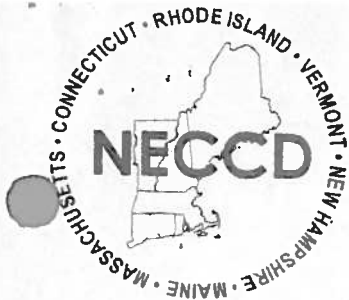
