As part of its organizational process, the Massachusetts Gaming Commission is about to consider adoption of a variety of personnel policies, including policies that deal with vacations, sick leave, insurance, benefits and other common ingredients of a comprehensive personnel policy. In addition, pursuant to G.L. c. 23K, § 3(m), the Commission will soon begin work on a code of ethics that is more restrictive than the code contained in G.L. c. 268A and 268B. The more restrictive code may, among other things, impose restrictions on the financial affairs of Commissioners and Commission staff more stringent that those contained in existing law.

The activities just described trigger the reporting and determination requirements contained in G.L. c. 268A, § 6. Accordingly, I am enclosing a letter to Governor Patrick containing the required disclosure and requesting that he make the appropriate determination.
