This letter is to request that Dr. Cousin may continue working in my laboratory as Research assistant professor. Dr. Cousin and I have been working together for over 10 years now. 7 years before we got married. She is one of the key personnel and a Co-PI on our NIH funded grant (RO1-DE016289). Dr. Cousin is participating in multiple aspects of the departmental life including teaching (Bio 580, Ansci 697, Ansci 220), training graduate students and performing research. Her publication record is comparable to most of our tenured faculty at the same level. She is going to be applying for funding to cover part or all of her own salary. Dr. Cousin is one of the very few people in the world that can perform microdissections and grafts of cranial neural crest. This aspect of the grant was identified by both NIH and NSF as one of the most attractive and innovative part of the grant and one of the main reason it was funded.

Dr. Cousin is applying to tenure track faculty positions but is limited in her search geographically given our status. She was one of the final candidates for a position at mount Holyoke college and MCLA. Her ultimate goal is to run her own independent research program. Dear Dr. Alfandari:

I acknowledge receipt of your March 25, 2013 Memorandum and Disclosure of Financial Interest. You request permission to continue to employ your spouse, Dr. Helene Cousins, as a Research Assistant Professor in your lab, and pay her through your NIH grant "Mechanism of Cranial Neural Crest Cell Migration" on which she is a co-PI.

You report that that Helene is among the few people in the world who can perfrom microdissections and grafts of cranial neural crest cells in embryos. This ability was a key component of the University's ability to procure funding for the grant.

Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 268A, Section 6, in part, prohibits a state employee from employing immediate family members and from compensating them for services rendered except when I "make a written determination that the interest is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of the services which the Commonwealth may expect from [... you], in which case it shall not be a violation for [... you] to participate in the particular matter." (M.G.L., Chapter 268A, Section 6.)

I determine that any personal interest you may have in this appointment is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of your services to the Commonwealth and the Department of Veterinary and Animal Sciences.

This determination, which will allow you to utilize the services of your spouse for one (1) year, must be reviewed and re-evaluated prior to any further appointment. A request should be submitted to the Chancellor of the Amherst campus to make such a review and reevaluating by May 1, 2014, if you wish to retain Dr. Helene Cousins in her work in your department and on your research project.

As directed by statute, I am sending a copy of this written "determination" letter, along with your memorandum and disclosure form, to the State Ethics Commission for filing. The statute requires you to advise the Ethics Commission of the nature and circumstances of the particular matter and make full disclosure of the financial interest. I am fulfilling that requirement by enclosing your memorandum and disclosure form along with a copy of this letter.
