Dear Dr. Novak:

I acknowledge receipt of your undated Memorandum and Disclosure of Financial Interest, dated September 11, 2013. You request permission to employ your spouse, Dr. Jerrold Meyer, on a NIH grant, as the Co-Principal Investigator.

You report that that Jerrold has a combination of skills that would be impossible to find in another Co-Principal Investigator and that seven (7) years ago, while serving as the PI on a subcontract of this grant, Dr. Meyer developed a revolutionary approach to studying the stress response system over time through a new procedure for quantifying cortisol from hair. His role in the grant is to provide assays of various substances in rhesus monkey hair, including cortisol and other relevant hormones. He is the world's leading expert on this topic, and this grant went through a successful competing renewal in large part because of this revolutionary procedure. In summary, a continuation of his appointment is crucial to the success of Dr. Novak's grant and future funding prospects.

Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 268A, Section 6, in part, prohibits a state employee from employing immediate family members and from compensating them for services rendered, except when I "make a written determination that the interest is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of the services which the Commonwealth may expect from [...you], in which case it shall not be a violation for [...you] to participate in the particular matter." (M.G.L., Chapter 268A, Section 6.)

I determine that any personal interest you may have in this appointment is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of your services to the Commonwealth and the Department of Public Health.

This determination, which will allow you to utilize the services of your spouse for one (1) year, must be reviewed and re-evaluated prior to any further appointment. A request should be submitted to the Chancellor of the Amherst campus to make such a review and reevaluated by August 1, 2014, if you wish to retain Dr. Jerrold Meyer in his work in your department and on your research project.

As directed by statute, I am sending a copy of this written "determination" letter, along with your memorandum and disclosure form, to the State Ethics Commission for filing. The statute requires you to advise the Ethics Commission of the nature and circumstances of the particular matter and make full disclosure of the financial interest. I am fulfilling that requirement by enclosing your memorandum and disclosure form along with a copy of this letter.

Dr. Jerrold Meyer is uniquely qualified to serve in the role as Co-Pi.

Seven years ago, while serving as the PI on a subcontract of this grant, Dr. Meyer developed a revolutionary approach to studying the stress response system (Davenport et al., 2006; 2008). Previously, all measures of the stress hormone, cortisol, whether from saliva or plasma represented brief time points. By developing a new procedure of quantifying cortisol from hair, Dr. Meyer was able to establish the first chronic measure of cortisol over a period of months. Since that time, Dr. Meyer has received samples from all over the world to measure hair cort in a variety of species. e.g., polar bears (3 publications), rhesus macaques (4 publications), greyhounds (study in process), humans with adverse childhood experiences (under review), stress in nurses (in process), mother-infant interactions (in process). His role on the grant is to provide assays of various substances in rhesus monkey hair, not only including cortisol but also other relevant hormones. He is the world's leading expert on this topic, and this grant went through a successful competing renewal in large part because of this revolutionary procedure.
