

***Massachusetts Counter-terrorism Training Seminar in Israel***  
***Jan. 24 – Feb. 1, 2016***

**Purpose:**

The training mission is intended to provide participants with information, resources and contacts that will enhance their abilities to combat terrorism and to strengthen relationships among key law enforcement leaders and agencies.

**Participants:**

Senior law enforcement professionals spend a week in Israel studying counter-terrorism strategies and tactics. This mission will bring together 14 senior law enforcement executives from Massachusetts.

**About the Seminar:**

ADL's Counter-terrorism Training Seminars in Israel provide senior law enforcement with cutting edge strategies, tactics and information to combat terrorism. Participants learn from some of the world's foremost counterterrorism experts with extensive first hand experience combating terrorism. Briefings and site visits are conducted by senior commanders in the Israel National Police, experts from Israel's intelligence and security services. The training combines formal presentations, site visits and behind the scenes tours, as well as an opportunity to see some of the important religious, historical and cultural sites in Israel.

Past participants have found the week in Israel to be a transformative experience, professionally and personally. The training provides them with an understanding of the way in which Israel protects its people from the constant threat of terrorism. Participants gain an appreciation not just of the strategies and tactics that Israel employs, but of the kind of leadership that is needed to fight both crime and terrorism simultaneously. Participants report feeling renewed and inspired professionally and profoundly affected on a personal level by the opportunity to visit holy places within Israel. The mission is also an opportunity to connect deeply with the people of Israel, with the nation and its struggle to live in peace and protect its citizen from terrorism.
