

THE LAYERS OF JERUSALEM

- Breakfast at the hotel.
- 8:30 a.m. *Israeli Society @ 2016*: Dialogue with scholar Paul Liptz of Tel Aviv University and the Hebrew Union College, at the hotel.
- Walking tour through the **Old City**, for guided visits to the Cardo, and the First Temple Period Broad Wall in the Jewish Quarter, and Jerusalem's famous Old City Market (shuk). Continue to the Christian Quarter, including the Via Dolorosa, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, high perches and deep caverns.
