I would like to continue to retain the services of my spouse, Mr. Gerald Locke, on a temporary, short-term basis on my current NIH funded R01 study entitled "Cadence-ADULTS." Mr. Locke possesses the requisite set of medical skills to support physician oversight by Dr. Stuart Chipkin, collaborating investigator on the project, for our data collection efforts using human subjects of varying age ranges. Medical oversight is prudent due to the increased risk of physical activity accruing to older cohort participants required for the study.
	His role on this project was previously approved to the end of Summer 2018, however, due to an unforeseen opportunity to pursue a diversity supplement to recruit a post-doc to the project, I decided to temporarily delay data collection during the 2017-2018 academic year. During this time Mr. Locke completed lab-required training, including participating in testing rehearsals with the team to maintain testing skills and team interactions. However, no study data were collected. Ultimately, we were successful and the supplement was awarded in April 2018 and our new post-doc has joined the lab. We are re-starting testing this week of June 04, 2018.
	Despite the delay in the testing schedule, I still need a qualified Exercise Testing Technologist to monitor subjects' EKG, blood pressure and general well-being while walking on a treadmill as called for in the human subject protocol approved by the IRB. Because the study scheduling of human subjects necessarily means the person with the Exercise Testing Technologist role must be flexible as to hours and days of work, I am challenged to find the necessary mix of training, skills and availability. Mr. Locke, my spouse, can provide the needed services on a flexible basis according to study needs. He will continue report to be supervised directly by Dr. Chipkin.
	We anticipate all data collection will be complete by end of March 2019. I am requesting to extend Mr. Locke's role on the project until that time.

Dear Chancellor Subbaswammy:

I am writing to request permission to extend the previously approved hire of my spouse, Mr. Gerald Locke, as an Exercise Testing Technologist specifically to support my current NIH R01 grant running in my Physical Activity and Health Lab in the Department of Kinesiology at the University of Massachusetts Amherst.

You approved his position last year with a termination date of August 31, 2018. Soon after your approval was granted, an unforeseen opportunity presented itself to pursue a diversity supplement to recruit a post-doc to the project. I therefore decided to temporarily delay data collection during the 2017-2018 academic year. During this time Mr. Locke completed labrequired training, including participating in testing rehearsals with the team to maintain testing skills and team interactions. However, no study data were collected during this interim period. Ultimately, we were successful and the supplement was awarded in April 2018 and our new post-doc has joined the lab. We re-starting testing this week (June 2018.

As indicated in my previous request, the parent award grant (and now the supplement) is funded specifically through the National Institute of Aging. The primary aim is to establish cadence (steps/min) thresholds in 21-85 year olds associated with objectively determined intensity, determined by indirect calorimetry. Participants walk on the treadmill at increasingly higher speeds during testing while we monitor cardiovascular response. We are now beginning testing of my oldest cohort (60-85 year olds), with intentions to complete data collection in early 2019. Also indicated previously, Ithough overall low, risk with exercise testing does increase with age and we have increased monitoring procedures with this age group. We have a medical investigator (Dr. Stuart Chipkin, Research Professor, and Department of Kinesiology) who is also a Co-Investigator charged with conducting a physical examination prior to testing when indicated, but we also continue to be in need of an Exercise Testing Technologist with specific skills who also has sufficient personal scheduling flexibility to manage our naturally inconsistent testing schedule. The specific skills required include experience administering exercise stress tests, including conducting EKG and ambulatory blood pressure monitoring. We have found that that few local EKG technicians with such expertise are sufficiently flexible in their personal scheduling to support our needs.

My husband is a licensed Nuclear Medicine Technologist who is currently employed per diem with Cooley Dickenson in North Hampton and also Manchester Memorial Hospital in Manchester, Connecticut. A per diem schedule is "as needed," and he continues to be very flexible in managing his own schedule.

My husband's particular skill set is essential to fulfilling my research commitment in a timely and safe manner. To facilitate any conflict of interest, Dr. Stuart Chipkin has agreed to continue supervising my husband, including conducting his performance reviews. This is appropriate; the Medical Investigator on my grant would naturally work most closely with the Exercise Testing Technologist. Although testing has been delayed due to our successful pursuit of a diversity supplement, this position is temporary, specific only to this study, and will no longer be needed once testing is completed by early 2019. This position has no role in data collection/management, analysis, or reporting of results. Rather, it is singularly focused on monitoring the health and welfare of the human subjects participating in the study.

I appreciate your consideration of this request which, if granted, will enable me to manage my grant's unique testing needs. Please do not hesitate to let me know if you have any questions.

Dear Professor Tudor-Locke:

I acknowledge receipt of your June 4, 2018 Disclosure of Financial Interest and Memorandum. You request permission to employ your husband, Gerald Locke, as an Exercise Testing Technologist for your NIH R01 grant entitled "Cadence-ADULTS".

You state that although I had approved your supervision of Mr. Locke through summer 2018, a hiring opportunity in your lab resulted in a delay in the testing schedule. As before, you have a personnel gap in your research staff that hampers your ability to proceed with your testing schedule. Due to flexibility issues with local EKG technicians, who have the specific skills required, you are requesting permission to continue to employ your husband, Gerald Locke. You further indicate that Mr. Locke is a Nuclear Medicine Technologist, who is currently employed per diem with two hospitals allowing him to be very flexible managing his own schedule, and is experienced in administering exercise stress tests, including conducting EKG and ambulatory blood pressure monitoring that are needed for this grant. Additionally, you indicate that to alleviate any concerns regarding the conflict of interest, Dr. Stuart Chipkin, who is the Department of Kinesiology's medical investigator, has agreed to supervise and conduct Gerald Locke's performance reviews.

Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 268A, Section 6, in part, prohibits a state employee from employing immediate family members and from compensating them for services rendered except when I "make a written determination that the interest is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of the services which the Commonwealth may expect from [...you], in which case it shall not be a violation for [...you] to participate in the particular matter." (M.G.L., Chapter 268A, Section 6.)

I determine that any personal interest you may have in this appointment is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of your services to the Commonwealth and the Department of Kinesiology. This determination will allow you to utilize the services of your husband through March, 2019.

The statute requires you to advise the Ethics Commission of the nature and circumstances of the particular matter make full disclosure of the financial interest. As directed by statute, I am sending a copy of this written determination letter, along with your memorandum and disclosure form, to the State Ethics Commission for filing.
