# Day Three: Saturday, December 7, 2019 THE LAYERS OF JERUSALEM

- Breakfast at an Israeli hotel is an experience in itself. Start the day with a bounteous buffet.
- Depart for the Old City.
- Take a walking tour through Jerusalem's Old City and the Jewish Quarter and experience the center of Jewish life, history, and holiness. Among the highlights will be:
- A walk along the rooftops that will provide an extraordinary scene of multi-faith Jerusalem. From this one spot, we will see the domes of three great religious landmarks: The Church of the Holy Sepulchre (marking where Jesus is believed to have been crucified); the Jewish Quarter's Hurva synagogue; and the Dome of the Rock, one of Islam's most sacred and beautiful sites.
- The Cardo, the main street of Roman-controlled Jerusalem and its spectacular Byzantine-era columns.
- King Hezekiah's Broad Wall, a massive wall built to protect Jerusalem from invasion 2,700 years ago.
- Hurva Square, the center of modern-day life in the Jewish Quarter.
- Lunch in the Old City.
- Enter the Christian Quarter.
- The conclusion of the Via Dolorosa is the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, the place where Jesus is believed to have been crucified. This church is one of Christianity's great pilgrimage sites and a testament to the remarkable diversity of the Christian world. It includes an empty tomb where it is said that Jesus was buried and resurrected.
- There will also be time to see the bargains and the bargaining in the **Old City Shuk** (market) in the Christian Quarter.
- Return to the hotel.
- 5:30 p.m. Israel and the Geopolitics of the Middle East: Meet with Nathan Jeffay, a specialist of geopolitics and the Middle East. TBC
- High Times in the Holy City: Explore Jerusalem's night life as a young "in the scene" Jerusalemite shows us around the clubs, cafés and bars hidden from most visitors to the capital.

### Day Four: Sunday, December 8, 2019 GEOPOLITICS: FROM THEORY TO FACT

We'll tour the Yad b' Yad (Hand in Hand) school in Jerusalem, part of a network of bilingual, multicultural educational institutions which aim to show that the two communities can learn and live together.

- 11:00 a.m. Is Religion the Way Forward or an Obstacle to Peace? We'll go beyond the Green Line to meet with Ali Abu Awwad and Rabbi Shaul Judelman from Shorashim (Roots), a program bringing West Bank Palestinians and their Jewish neighbors together despite their fears and suspicions,
- 1:00 p.m. My Home in Gush Etzion: Meet with Eve Harrow, a local resident of Gush Etzion at lunch at the Gush Etsion winery.
- 2:30 p.m. The Geopolitics of Jerusalem: Travel through the city of Jerusalem exploring some of the political and diplomatic complexities of recent years; drive around the seam zone with an indepth study seminar on the ramifications of current developments with Col. (Res.) Danny Tirza, one of the seam zone's designers.
- Return to hotel & free time.
- 6:30 p.m. Israeli Politics Through a Gender Lens: Dialogue with Hamutal Guri, a specialist in program and leadership development for social change, over dinner at Anna, a Mediterranean restaurant with an Italian influence, situated in the serene and historic Ticho House in Jerusalem's city center.

# Day Five: Monday, December 9, 2019 MEMORY & RENEWAL

- 8:00 a.m. Navigate Your Way Through the Labyrinth of Israel Politics: Join Professor Reuven
  Hazan of the Political Science Department at Hebrew University for an introduction into Israel's
  turbulent political scene where coalition governments and powerful ideological divisions are a
  fact of life.
- 9:30 a.m. Transportation Challenges in Jerusalem Meet with a representative of the light train company (Name TBA)
- 11:00 a.m. Innovation for Inclusion: The innovation lab at the ALYN Pediatric Hospital is
  researching and producing new technologies to improve the lives of children with special needs.
  We'll talk with medical entrepreneurs about their work and its impact, and visit their state-of-theart laboratory.
- Lunch en route.
- 2:00 p.m. The Holocaust and Contemporary Israeli Society: Dr. Rachel Korazim will examine how Yad Vashem reflects the Israeli understanding of the Shoah. In particular, we'll explore the radically different ways in which secular Zionist and ultra-Orthodox leaders understood the causes and meaning of the Holocaust. Dr. Korazim is a renowned educator and expert on Israel and the Holocaust. This will take place at Mount Herzl.
- 3:15 p.m. Visit Yad Vashem, the national memorial to the six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust, an essential emotional and educational experience. Your guided tour will include:
- The Avenue of the Righteous, where trees symbolic of the renewal of life have been planted along with plaques honoring brave non-Jews who saved Jews during the Shoah.
- The Historical Museum, a state-of-the-art interactive display reflecting decades of research and educational expertise. The story of the Holocaust, with an emphasis on individual victims, is told through survivor testimonies, original artifacts, and personal possessions saved from the ghettos and camps.
- The Children's Memorial, commemorating the 1.5 million children lost during the Holocaust.
- Drive through the Israeli "Capitol Hill": along the Knesset Israel's Parliament and its famous Menorah, the Supreme Court building, the Prime Minister's Office, the Israeli National Bank, and the future site of the Israel National Library.
- 6:00 p.m. Where Next for Israel's Democracy? Tour the Knesset and discuss the tensions and strengths of Israel's democracy. We'll meet with a Knesset member and hear about the key political issues in the country today (possibly MK Orly Levy Abecassis or MK Karin Elharar pending confirmation).
- Our Thoughts, Our Journey: Come together to share experiences and feelings from your journey so far.
- Free evening to explore Jerusalem on your own.

### Day Six: Tuesday, December 10, 2019 THE MOSAIC OF JERUSALEM AND ITS SURROUNDINGS

  grassroots activists in Israel, Palestine, and abroad who are working to build the human
  infrastructure needed to create the conditions for a resolution to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

- 10:30 a.m. Ramallah is a Palestinian city on the West Bank, the controversial and complex area split between Israeli control and limited Palestinian self-government. The political center of the Palestinian Authority, Ramallah is sometimes called the "de facto capital of the state of Palestine."
- Life in Palestine, 2019: Tour the streets of Ramallah with Rami Nazzal, an internationally
  published Palestinian journalist. He will provide an authentic, even-handed but raw, account of
  Palestinian life, politics, and aspirations.
- Lunch will be at a Ramallah restaurant or café.
- As we drive north on the Trans-Israel Highway, there will be an opportunity to see the Security
   Barrier which runs along the seam zone between Israel and the Palestinian territories, and to learn about the barrier's effects on Israeli security and Palestinian communities.
- Drive to Haifa, Israel's largest port is also the city where the country's Jewish and Arab populations live most closely together. We'll explore multicultural, multi-faith Haifa.

Kuchinate (meaning crochet in Tigrinya) is a collective that celebrates African art and culture while empowering women asylum-seekers, many of whom suffered great hardships while fleeing to Israel.

   Street with speaker.

- Beginnings: Modern Tel Aviv grew out of ancient Jaffa. Gaze out over the Mediterranean Sea; learn why Jaffa, mentioned in the biblical story of Jonah and the Whale, is so historically important; and see how its Old City reflects the present as well as the past.
- 10:30 a.m. The Innovation Nation: The newly opened Israeli Innovation Center celebrates the people and companies that are making Israel the "innovation nation." Located at the Peres Center for Peace and Innovation, it includes continually updated, high-tech exhibits on everything from artificial intelligence to the latest developments in water use. We will be welcomed by Nadav Tamir, Senior Advisor for Governmental and International Affairs at the Peres Center.
- A Fallen Leader, A Fallen Soldier: The assassination of Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin in 1995 was one of the great traumas of Israeli political history. We'll also see how Rabin Square has become one of the crucial public spaces in Israel and the location for political protests, state ceremonies and spontaneous celebrations.

  saltiest piece of water in the world, nine times saltier than the ocean, but the weightless feeling
  of floating is great fun.

- What We've Seen and Felt During Our Journey: Share the experiences and discoveries that have
  inspired you during this trip as we get ready to say Shalom U'lehitraot (Bye and see you soon) to
  Israel.
- 7:00 p.m. Farewell dinner at at the Kitchen market restaurant.
- Transfer to Ben Gurion International Airport and check in for your return flight to the US.
