## Financial interest in the matter

One of the Commissioner of Revenue's co-defendants in this matter is Cellco Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless ("Cellco"), which I understand to be a subsidiary of Verizon Communications, Inc. ("Verizon"). My wife and I own shares of the common stock of Verizon in a joint brokerage account. The shares were purchased in 2016, six years before my participation in this case, and they represent a relatively small percentage of our total assets, which are diversified in various stocks, bonds, mutual funds and other investments.

It is unclear whether this joint ownership gives my wife and me a "financial interest" in the *Pixley* matter, as that phrase is used in G.L. c. 268A, § 6. The Pixley matter was brought in 2017 by cell phone purchasers who challenge the manner in which Massachusetts sales tax has been imposed and collected on sales of cell phones in "bundled" transactions. The plaintiffs sought monetary and declaratory relief against the Commissioner of Revenue, and also against several cell phone vendors, including Cellco. The Commissioner moved to dismiss the complaint in Superior Court, and that motion was granted in 2018. Thereafter, plaintiffs stipulated to the dismissal of Cellco and the other vendor defendants from the case without prejudice. Plaintiffs have now appealed the dismissal of its claims against the Commissioner to the Appeals Court, and that appeal is in the process of being briefed. It appears that Cellco and the other vendor defendants will not be filing any briefing, or otherwise participating, in the Appeals Court case that I am currently working on (by their own choice). However, it is possible that the financial interest of Cellco could be affected by resolution of the appeal. In the case, the legal and financial interests of the codefendants Commissioner and Cellco are aligned in certain respects (for example, full dismissal of all claims in the case would presumably inure to their mutual benefit), but they are not necessarily aligned in all respects.

The amount at stake for Cellco with respect to the claims of the named plaintiffs in the *Pixley* case is very small (probably in the hundreds of dollars). However, the matter was originally brought as a putative class action, which could increase Cellco's exposure. But no class has been certified to date, and no motion for class certification has been filed. Verizon's net income for 2021 was approximately \$ 22 billion, and its revenue was approximately \$133 billion.

I have disclosed our Verizon common stock ownership to my supervisor Timothy Casey, Chief of the Constitutional and Administrative Law Division of the Attorney General's Office, and he has no objection to my continuing representation of the Commissioner.

I am 100% confident that my and my wife's ownership of Verizon stock will have no impact on the manner in which I litigate and handle this case, and will not affect any position that I take on behalf of the Commissioner in this case.
