Dear Chancellor Reyes,

I am writing to request permission to renew the appointment of my spouse, Dr. Hen-Ming Wu, from February 25, 2025 to February 24, 2026, who was appointed Research Associate Professor in September 1997 when I joined the faculty at the University of Massachusetts. He was promoted to Research Professor A starting in the 2014 academic year after a full review based on his research performance and adhering to the standards and criteria for promotion reviews in our department and the College of Natural Sciences, and without my participation. Dr. Wu was supported through these years by research grants from federal funding agencies including the NIH, DOE, NSF and USDA, some as co-investigator (NIH) or co-Principle Investigator (co-PI) with me (as PI), some Dr. Wu was the sole PI, or with me as the co-PI. These projects are all of a collaborative nature that utilizes our overlapping expertise in molecular biology and biochemistry, complementary knowledge in biophysics, genetics, and cell biology, and mutual interests in a broad range of biological phenomena.

Dr. Wu and I have been collaborators since before arriving on the UMass Amherst campus. Our research focuses on understanding the fundamental mechanisms that control how plants grow, develop, and reproduce. With these as the common core of our studies, Dr. Wu plays a leading role in investigating how various hormonal signals regulate cellular and molecular processes to achieve proper growth and development, an area broadly known as signal transduction, while I lead the investigation on dissecting the mechanisms that underlie pollination and fertilization. We contribute equally in different ways to every project in our laboratory as both areas of research depend on similar experimental expertise and both of us are knowledgeable with the fundamental principles behind each of these topics.

Dr. Wu is an invaluable member of my research laboratory who participates in all aspects of the research. He has made immense contributions to research in our lab as well as to the educational mission of our campus. He has been a co-author on close to 70 publications, with close to 60 of them from UMass in the last 27 years, some serving as either the first or

senior author, many of them are highly cited and in very reputable journals. He is instrumental in mentoring research trainees at all levels, including postdoctoral fellows, graduate students, and undergraduates. His expertise in molecular biology, biochemistry, and biophysics are synergistic with my expertise in genetics and cell biology. His combination of skills would be impossible to find in another hire as he has been working in the area of plant reproduction and signal transduction since 1988. During our tenure at UMass, we have mentored more than eighty undergraduates, most of them on multi-year projects, and many are co-authors on papers with direct contributions to reported results. We are an internationally known team but Dr. Wu is known in his own right for having made important contributions to our field, and reputed to be creative and dedicated as well as generous in helping to advance the research of others in our field. His continued appointment on the UMass faculty not only ensures the success of our own research program but will also continue to contribute to the vibrancy and visibility of research activity at UMass. He is clearly an asset to the University.

Dr. Wu will need a reappointment for February 25, 2025. His salary (17.8% time, at \$24,806.59 annually) will be 100% funded by the NIH grant entitled "Deciphering Male- and Female-coordinated Gating Mechanisms that Ensure Plant Reproductive Success" on which he is a co-investigator.

Your permission for the renewal of Dr. Wu's appointment will allow a long-standing productive collaboration to continue.

Dear Professor Cheung:

I acknowledge receipt of your Disclosure of Financial Interest and Memorandum, both dated January 10, 2025. You request permission to reappoint your spouse, Dr. Hen-Ming Wu, as a Research Professor A in your lab. You indicate that Dr. Wu would be paid through the NIH grant on which he is a co-investigator, entitled, "Deciphering Male- and Female-coordinated Gating Mechanisms that Ensure Plant Reproductive Success", at an annual salary of \$24,806.59, at 17.8% effort.

You report that you and Dr. Wu have been collaborators since prior to your joining the UMASS Amherst faculty, and that your research focuses on understanding the fundamental mechanisms that control how plants grow, develop, and reproduce. As further detailed in your Disclosure and Memorandum, you indicate that Dr. Wu's expertise in molecular biology, biochemistry, and biophysics are synergistic with your expertise in genetics and cell biology, and that his combination of skills would be impossible to find in another hire, as he has been working in the area of plant reproduction and signal transduction since 1988. You state that Dr. Wu has made immense contributions to research in your lab as well as to the educational mission of the campus by being a co-author on close to 70 publications, with close to 60 of them from UMass in the last 27 years. You believe that his appointment on the UMASS faculty not only ensures the success of your own research program, but also will continue to contribute to the vibrancy and visibility of research activity at UMASS.

Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 268A, Section 6, in part, prohibits a state employee from employing immediate family members and from compensating them for services rendered except when I "make a written determination that the interest is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of the services which the Commonwealth may expect from [...you], in which case it shall not be a violation for [...you] to participate in the particular matter."

I determine that any personal interest you may have in this appointment is not so substantial as to be deemed likely to affect the integrity of your services to the Commonwealth and the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology. This determination to re-appoint your spouse will allow you to utilize his services for one (1) year from February 25, 2025 to February 24, 2026.
