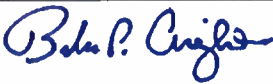

Those meetings will include discussion of the recently enacted Massachusetts law that provides for a licensing pathway for internationally trained physicians, trade and economic development opportunities between the Dominican Republic and Massachusetts, educational partnerships, and other issues of mutual interest between the Dominican Republic and Massachusetts.

Massachusetts is home to a large Dominican American population, and there are significant economic, cultural, legal, and educational issues of mutual interest to the Dominican Republic and Massachusetts. Itinerary

Day 1: Tuesday, January 21, 2025

ARRIVE BY 2PM JAN 21: Arrival in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic (Flight)

4:00 PM: Guided tour of the Colonial Zone with Dominican Senator Alexis Victoria Yeb.
(to explore the historic heart of Santo Domingo)

DAY 2: Wednesday, January 22, 2025

Activities:

10:00 AM: Visit to the Dominican Republic Senate Reception by Senate President Ricardo de los Santos. US Ambassador in D.R Patricia Aguilera will attend, with university presidents and representatives. *(Representatives from medical education or medical studies universities to discuss recent Massachusetts law that provides a licensing pathway for internationally trained physicians.).*

12:00 PM: Lunch with the Dominican Senate, US Ambassador, and University presidents, and representatives.

2:30 PM: Meeting with Dominican Republic Minister of Foreign Affairs, Roberto Álvarez and staff. *To discuss opportunities for collaboration driven by Massachusetts' large Dominican population and its vital role in fostering ties between the two regions. Discussion will focus on strengthening bilateral relations, as well as expanding economic and educational partnerships.*

4:00 PM: Visit to Pro Dominicana *(the national center responsible for promoting Dominican exports, investments, and business opportunities worldwide)*. Reception by Director Biviana Riveiro.

7:00 PM: Dinner with the Rica Business Group. *(Leader in the Dominican Republic's food and beverage industry specializing in premium dairy and beverage production, embodies innovation and sustainability.) To exchange ideas on sustainable practices, and fostering*

economic collaboration between the two regions.

DAY 3: Thursday, January 23, 2025

Activities:

8:30 AM: Breakfast with the Dominican Republic Industry Association, the National Council of Private Enterprises (AIRD and CONEP), and Carolina Mejía, Mayor of Santo Domingo. *The discussion with members of the Massachusetts Senate aims to foster collaboration and strengthen ties between Massachusetts and the Dominican Republic through an exchange of ideas on economic development, innovation, and shared opportunities.*

12:00 PM: Interview with “Show de Mediodía” Established in 1977 it is the most popular morning show in the D.R. and it's seen by Dominican Americans in the Commonwealth. MA Senate delegation will participate in this live segment where they will *engage and highlight the strong cultural and economic ties between Massachusetts and the Dominican Republic, and the work that they do in their district to represent the Dominican community.*
